In Between Lines, a theatre-maker and a visual artist share family letters, documentation, conversations, archival images – and their respective skills - in exploring different perspectives on the experience of WWI.

Carol Kite is an award-winning printmaker whose work incorporating drawing, painting and found objects presents both as wall-hung artwork and as articulated panels that can be approached as artist books and as small sculptures. Illustrating the written words of three brothers from Ballarat, expressing their longing for home, the episodic nature of her images become a visual diary of a series of places, memories and experiences linked by the themes of duty and loss.

As a theatre-maker, **Tammie Kite** is noted for creating work with a strong connection to storytelling, music and design. Artistic Director of Melbourne's INNATUM Theatre, she guides explorations of human experience from sublime, light-filled moments to the realm of terror and shadows. In **Between Lines**, Tammie concentrates on the passing of information between home and the war front through the ephemeral media of radio broadcasts, propaganda, carrier pigeon messages.

While this indirect communication lacks the immediacy of personal letters, it establishes the faceted background to the experiences at the foundation of this exhibition.

Carol and Tammie Kite are invested in engaging community response to their expression of how their family experienced WWI.

Ballarat RSL President Alex Tascas will open Between Lines on Saturday, 9 April from 2pm by speaking about her organisation's commitment to conserving its remarkable collection of WWI artifacts.

Recognising the invaluable support that animals provided throughout WWI – as transport, sentries, scouts, messengers, companions – the artists are also hosting a special 'Dogs In War' Day on 16 April, when visitors are invited to bring their leashed pets to Backspace Gallery in honour of the role of canines on the war front.

Rounding out their creative conversation with the Ballarat community, **Between Lines** will close with an afternoon of **Artist Talks on Sunday**, **1 May**, in which Carol and Tammie will outline the trajectory of their individual practices and how that has fed development of work for this collaborative Backspace Gallery show.

LGBTI MULTICULTURAL GRANTS

The Victorian Government values and celebrates diversity. Gender and sexual diversity is found in all societies and amongst people of all faiths, and just as we respect and celebrate cultural and religious diversity, we respect the diversity of gender and sexuality that exists in our community. We affirm the right to equality, fairness and docency for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans and gender diverse and Intersex (LGBTI) Victorians and we are committed to removing discrimination from Victorian laws.

LGBTI people often tace violence and discrimination because of prejudice and a lack of understanding. Cultural values and religious beliefs are major factors that confirmit culturally diverse LGBTI people. In addition rucism within LGBTI communities, can make it harder for culturally diverse LGBTI people to fall accepted and access the support and services they need.

LOBIT people experience higher levels of anolety, depression and significently higher rates of suicide compared to heterosexual counterparts. It is important to recognise that merginelisation and decrimination are the predominant contributing factors, rather than gender and sexual diversity.

The LGBTI Muticultural Grants announced by the Victorian Government will support capacity buildin and inclusive services and programs for culturally diverse LGBTI people.


Priorities for LGBTI Multicultural Grants

- Working with LGBTI communities and organisations to support them to be more inclusive of people from culturally diverse backgrounds.
- Working with faith based and culturally diverse communities, particularly recently arrived and emerging communities, to increase acceptance of LGBTI community members.
- Increasing apportunities for peer support for LGBTI people from outsirally diverse backgrounds. Building the capacity of LGBTI outsirally diverse community groups.
- Working with CALD services to make them more LGBTI inclusive, and with LGBTI services to make them more inclusive of cultural diversity.






